From the Pastor

The Rev. Michael Wasylik

Olivet Congregational Church has embarked on the journey to fill the empty position of Christian Education Director, very well held these past three years by Grace Anderson. The Christian Education committee has met and done some thoughtful work examining the job description in light of Olivet's needs. The committee's recommendations will go to council for final approval, and it is my hope that we will begin to post the position in August. I believe it will serve us well to search until we find

the right candidate, as opposed to rushing to fill the position. Grace and the Christian Education committee have done excellent work in preparing us for the fall, granting us the liberty of time.

I view Christian Education as the key area of growth for Olivet over the next three years. Therefore, please permit me to share my thoughts about the importance of Christian Education and its function within Olivet. Moreover, I write to you not only as a pastor, but also as a parent whose children will travel the entire length of Christian Education within Olivet.

I view Christian Education first and foremost as *Faith Formation*. Christian Education implies learning about *what* to believe. Faith formation implies learning *to* believe – a gift that will last a lifetime. Although content is vitally important, especially Bible literacy, it is the mentoring of children by faithful adults that will have the longest lasting influence on the life of a child. We learn *to* believe by relating with people who *do* believe.

To this end, I strongly value an *intergenerational* ministry in the classroom and in worship. For example, a best practice in ministry has been that each Sunday school class be taught by three people of three different generations – an adult with school-aged children, an “older adult” (sorry, no other way to say it), and a confirmation or post-confirmation aged youth. Such an approach would envelop our children in kindness and wisdom, give the youth a chance to teach, and give the children something to which they may aspire. Moreover, I would like the children to be steeped in learning *how* to worship, and to have the new director be in worship with the children every week.

Someone has recently asked me how we make the switch from a paradigm of Christian Education to one of faith formation. I replied, “Emphasize the in-between places.” The transitions between childhood and confirmation, confirmation and youth group, and youth group and young adulthood are saturated with risk and possibility. These “in-between places” are where we can lose our kids to the increasingly powerful influence of the world, or teach them to navigate the changes in life that can shake our faith. To this end, I think it important that Olivet begin to stress *rites of passage* as a way to mark a child’s entrance into the next phase of life, and to surround

them with love as they make the change.

Traditionally, confirmation has been the primary rite of passage in a child’s life at Olivet. I envision confirmation becoming a two-year process whereby the confirmand spends the first year learning how to read their Bible and understand core elements our faith, and spends the second year learning how to be an adult within the church. Specifically, they would be on church committees, serve as Sunday school teachers, and participate in mission within the community.

I remember the first time that I looked at a map to find where Olivet was placed within Saint Paul – and I found it within easy reach of *five* colleges and universities. I would hope that whoever directs our faith formation would have a heart for those who are transitioning to adulthood. We have many wonderful people among us who would be able to mentor college-aged students into adult life, into careers and family. We have a beautiful space in which to worship, and there is no reason that we can’t invite people to have their weddings here, and then stay to raise their families here – in a place where people love to worship God and who care for each other. And the cycle goes on.

Let me end on a pragmatic note. Faith formation is the most natural way to reach out to the community. Church growth should never be a goal in and of itself, but it is always a byproduct of taking seriously the act of faith formation. Families will look for a church that will love their children. We love our children, and now we need a way to show the world that we do such a thing. I invite you to join me in supplication toward God who is leading us – and our children – toward abundant life at Olivet. Please do not hesitate to contact me with your own dreams and desires for faith formation at Olivet.

Dear Olivet Members and Friends,

This is the last “Grace Notes” column that I will be writing for the *Olivetian*. In the past three years, I have written on many aspects of ministry with children, youth and families. I have witnessed a time in the life of this congregation when a sort of inventory is being taken. Olivet is being asked “What are our treasured traditions here and what new areas of growth are we willing to explore.”

A part of that questioning has taken place in the Christian Education and Youth Advisory Committees. What I am witnessing is a new generation of parents coming into leadership roles in the congregation. Some treasured traditions are being cared for, such as Senior Sermons, the annual Children’s Sunday worship service, the Children’s Christmas Program and the bi-annual youth mission trips.

Some new traditions and opportunities have also sprouted in these past three years. Sunday School was reintroduced. The Children’s Time in worship has become a regular part of the service. Our Youth Group now meets regularly on Wednesday evenings. We have also shown our continuing commitment to the Heifer Project with our Children’s Annual Meeting, at which the children vote on how to donate their Sunday School offering. I am so glad that a service component has been added to our Children’s Wednesday Night program. I could keep going but I hope you get the idea.

In the past year, we have elected new leadership for the children, youth and family ministry programs. With this new leadership there is a renewed energy full of creative ideas and a strong sense of commitment. I sense that Olivet’s ministry to its children, youth and family is ready to take off!

As for me, I am looking forward to my work as a chaplain resident with the Healthiest Care System. It will be a year of learning and growth that I can only imagine. It is a time of great anticipation and learning. I will take with me Olivet in my heart as I move into this new ministry.

Many people have asked me if I will continue worshipping at Olivet. When I joined Olivet, I maintained my membership at Macalester Plymouth United Church in St. Paul. But that doesn’t mean that I won’t attend occasional programs or worship services at Olivet. I may even try one of those yoga classes again!

So, in conclusion, thank you to all of you at Olivet who have touched my life and my daughter Sarah’s life. We will be leaving richer and our faith deeper from our time together.

Olivet Church Council Minutes

Olivet Church Council Meeting: June 14, 2011

Present: Jeff Benjamin, Sarah Senaratna, Nancy Berry, Joel Peterson, Caroline Stone, Cris Lien, Holly Stoerker, Margaret Tabar and the Rev. Michael Wasylik.

Absent: Christian Soltermann, Paul Clasen, and Barb Nilles

Opening: Michael Wasylik offered an opening prayer, and Council members shared joys and concerns.

Minutes: The minutes of the May 10, 2011 meeting were approved. Wording in the May minutes was revised to read: Tom McClellan recommends increasing the Building Ordinance section of our insurance coverage so that in case of a fire, the building could be rebuilt to current code standards, which would include installing an elevator. The council agreed to increase insurance coverage by \$200,000 at an annual cost of \$220. Total Building Ordinance coverage would then be \$300,000. The total coverage on the building as of our last renewal (November 21, 2010) was \$4,061,000. In addition there is Personal Property coverage of \$610,000.

Sarah Senaratna reports that the Christian Education committee is clarifying nursery policies so older children can be welcomed and accommodated when there is no Sunday school.

Moderator's Report: Further discussion of the phrase "radical hospitality" led Council members to agree to read a common article for discussion at the July meeting. Holly Stoerker agreed to research and recommend a reading.

The council acknowledged the resignation of Grace Anderson. Prior to initiation of the hiring procedure, the Christian Education committee members are reviewing the duties and hours of the Director of Christian Education and Sunday

School teacher positions which are both unfilled.

The Council approved a motion to bring various independently operating small groups under the umbrella of the Adult Education committee for training and support purposes.

The Council encouraged further development of the liturgical stole project which will be led by Holly. Original designs and samples from the creation of the dossal screen have been uncovered which will be helpful in this project and may lead to an artistic display.

Treasurer's Report: Barb Nilles provided a positive financial statement.

Stewardship: Joel Peterson reported an offering of \$278 to the UCC Strengthen the Church mission offering.

Membership: The annual all church picnic is being planned for early in August and will be held at the Highland Park picnic area.

Diaconate Report: Holly distributed a written Deacons' report with comments about the May Deacons' Sunday, healing prayers during communion, prayers for the youth group during their summer mission trip to Arkansas, and the importance of confidentiality.

Christian Education: A year-long curriculum has just been instituted. This summer, the children's Sunday program includes Bible stories that focus on various heroes, supplemented with a nice mix of games & crafts.

The next Council meeting will be on July 12, 2010 at 7:00 p.m. Michael closed the meeting with prayer.
